


FRIENDS OF MIDAS IS PRESERVING THE HISTORY OF MIDAS, NEVADA



The GOLD CIRCLE WATER COMPANY was incorporated in Nevada on April 22, 1908. The stock certificate (to the left) represented 100 shares and was issued on July 18th, 1908....as were others to the same party: C. F. Jonasson & Co. The water system went through several owner/operators until Evelyn Sabin deeded her interest over to the newly formed, Nevada non-profit Midas Water Cooperative in 1989. This stock certificate was acquired at auction and the seller stated that the same company operated a water system in Goldfield.

The claims for the EASTERN STAR MINING COMPANY were located in the Gold Circle Mining District. approximately eight miles east of Midas, Nevada. The original claims ran from northwest to southeast encroaching on Squaw Valley property. Much of the original framework is still scattered about the north end of claim #2 which was the southern most claim. The stock certificate shown here (to the right) was issued in 1915. The earliest issue date for a stock certificate of the Eastern Star Mining Company in the FOM collection is 1912, representing 1000 shares. The original issue was for 1,000,000 shares at a stated par value of \$1.00 per share.





The small structure sandwiched between the fuel shop and the assay office is being prepared to house two one- lunger generators. The belt driven machines are fully functional and will be viewable from the front. The smaller of the two is a Montgomery Ward donated by the Unger Family several years ago. The larger machine is a Fairbanks-Morse and was donated by the Elmore Family. Both machines were meticulously restored by Rick Isaeff and Andy Richards. Leaning against the window frame on the right is a two wheeler handcart donated by Jim & Pat Swisher. New window glass was installed and donated by Viper Glass in Winnemucca. Much of the lumber used on this project was donated by Frank Gabica, owner of Tallman Lumber. Old corrugated tin was donated by the Isaeffs.

In 2003, a small silver ingot with the initials O.W.B. from the Elko Prince Mine was acquired by FOM. This ingot was poured for Oscar Wilhelm Berg, Superintendent of the mill from 1919 to 1922. This Berg Family heirloom has been presented to Len Berg, son of O. W. Berg. William Berg, grandson, has prepared an appropriate display for this ingot and other family memorabelia. Len Berg was born in Midas in 1918 and for the last several years he has made an annual trip to reminisce in his hometown.















Miner's Cabin

Built with railroad ties in the 1920's, this old cabin was once occupied by a miner who worked a claim about 100 yards to the north. A house once stood directly southwest from the cabin in the middle of Main Street. When this portion of Main Street was relocated to its present location, the house was bulldozed.

Within the last few years, the wood shingle roof on the cabin was removed and replaced with corrugated tin. Many years ago, the rail road ties were chinked with rags and rope. An unusual wood heating stove with a foot operated damper is in the corner with an old "captain's chair" and spittoon nearby. Cooking utensils and pans are stacked around the kerosene cooking stove and oven. On one of the iron beds are two galvanized wash tubs, scrub board and a hand crank ringer. On an old trunk lies an early-day Sears Roebuck catalog ready for another trip to the privy...which is a few steps from the cabin door. Over the inside doorframe hangs a shot gun and a candle holder. Four strategically located kerosene lanterns provide light. A small window allows the air to be conditioned.

Outside and within easy reach of the front door are hanging a couple of old frying pans and a griddle. Situated on the back side of the cabin is a screened frame used to keep food and beverages chilled in the warmer months. Water dripped from a small tin can over the metal top onto gunny sack material and the breeze did the rest.

This property is owned by Gus & Lori Wegren. The cabin is one of the few remaining early structures still standing in Midas. Wegrens kindly allowed FOM to feature these photographs of the cabin's interior, which is rarely accessible to the public.
