





Thanks to the generosity of two lifetime members, FOM shared in the proceeds of the sale of their real property. There can be some tax advantages to include real estate in your donations.



There has been, seemingly forever, Nevada lore around that says if you get a drink out of Spring Creek before leaving, you will return some day. We have no record of who gets a drink and who doesn't, but here are some friends who recently found their way back to Midas.

Dave Arnold was the hay boss for Ellison Ranching Company a few years He is one of those people who works hard and plays hard and enjoys his life with a good sense of humor. Full of stories about the people who worked around him, Dave is married and restores old cars..... Steve McClain, is another ex-Ellison employee with a lot of stories about the good ol' days. Steve was a cowboy, a silversmith, a wagon restorer, a rancher and now a miner. Dave Brady made an appearance to visit some friends and see if the town was the same as it was when he left several years ago. He has nurtured an interest in the history of Nevada and Midas and looks forward to lending the knowledge he has acquired. Yvonne Griffith said it has been about 30 years since she was last in Midas. She was seen walking with a couple of granddaughters. Her son is Angelo Granata. He has moved back from Arizona to his beloved Nevada and Midas. In the good old days, the Putnam Family headed for Midas on the weekends. They owned the place that Angelo owns now. Jerry and Sue shopped around this last year and found some vintage items FOM will use in displays. A beautiful old chest of drawers, now displayed at the laundry/seamstress shop was among the many items which came from their own family. Lester Sweeney grew up on the Squaw Valley Ranch where his dad was the ranch manager from the mid thirties to the early fifties. Lester is a recognized historian of this has a myriad of experiences he loves to talk about. prepared a written narrative of his life at the ranch and in Midas in the 40's where he attended school. He also brought several old items, such as the Rebel Creek Ranch apple press that was given to his dad and an original clock from the Midas School. His brother, Patrick Sweeney gets credit for saving the clock. Among many other things, Lester and his wife Cheri made it possible for FOM to acquire a sewing machine for heavy leather items which was used at the Lower Clover Ranch and some vintage personal items of "Hungry Joe" Harvath, who was bar owner in Midas a long time ago. Lester's long time friend, Gene Timmons and his wife, Barbara, returned to Midas with an old mining wheelbarrow which played a significant role in their marriage ceremony. Gene and Barbara's daughter, Beth (Timmons) Stern and her husband, Eric are in the process of restoring the Timmons' place to its original splendor. After a year-long absence, a father and son, Keith and Jordan Thompson teamed up for the 4th of July horseshoe tournament and won the championship. Want to come back?? Be sure to drink above the herd!!

TRAVEL/NEVADA said:

"Even though Midas most certainly faced some challenges, the town has never been completely abandoned. Electricity was introduced to the community in 1989 and the town barely survives today. A handful of people live in Midas, mostly hunting enthusiasts or retirees looking to escape the hustle and bustle of big city life.

With the main street comprised of dilapidated ghost town relics peppered with new, fancy hunting lodges, the combination of old and new makes any time spent in Midas fascinating. Vistors will find that there are no services here, except a tried and true Nevada staple: a bar. Travelers can enjoy the Midas Bighorn Saloon after exploring interesting ruin, but travelers beware...even this establishment has limited open-for-business hours. Changing seasonnally, the Midas Bighorn Saloon is typically open Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday evenings to refresh road-weary explorers.

Be sure to check out unfathomably cool artifacts like the old fueling station, complete with a fuel pump and rusty truck, weathered sarsaparilla signs contrasting aged buildings and even some old mining equipment. Most certainly a wanderer's utopia, everyone must opt for an afternoon in Midas. It certainly will be an experience you won't forget."
