Thirty Years of Historic Preservation

Incorporated at the end of 1994, Friends of Midas officially launched in 1995. The first project centered on restoring the Midas Cemetery; it continues today. In the past 30 years, FOM has published a book about the history of Midas, providing copies to schools and libraries across Nevada; amassed an extensive archive; acquired property for exhibits; and installed historic signs, among many other projects. This small nonprofit, generously supported by folks who love this old town, remains focused on the preservation and presentation of the history of Midas and the Gold Circle Mining District it anchors.

Last October's wildfire emphasized the risk of keeping FOM's archive in town, and a project is underway to transfer photos and other materials to the Elko Museum where they will be safe and available for research.

Families often contact FOM for information about relatives who lived here in the past. In 2024, it was rewarding to provide information to the Neiss Family of New York about Fred Neiss who lived in Midas from 1908 to 1926 and to confirm for Henry Voss's family that he rests in the Midas Cemetery. Visitors included relatives of George Boucher, longtime Elko County Manager; of Ken Fox who relished his 1930s childhood here; and of Frank and Bell Macy who arrived in 1907 and raised their four daughters in Midas.

As FOM enters its fourth decade, many more stories and photos will be added to the website. Point your browser to FriendsofMidas.org to read the final report on the Midas Cemetery's ground-penetrating radar project and stories about the people mentioned in this newsletter. Much more to come!



May they all rest in peace.


